- Plan and/or participate in gathering data, resources and partners to implement approved advocacy action plans and communication strategies.
- Develop policies and position statements for the ARPA Board of Directors, partners and other key stakeholders.
- Recommend to the ARPA Board of Directors (and assist in carrying out) actions, strategies and related communications that will ensure that the recreation and parks sector is timely in its responses to issues both on its own and through partners and members.
- The Committee will plan to meet every two months virtually with the potential for work assignments between meetings.
